The 2020 Honorary **MusicNL Legacy Awards** celebrated two Newfoundland music venues for their outstanding contribution to live music: **The Strand Lounge** in St. John's and **Wheeler's Lounge** in Noel's Pond, Stephenville. For decades these two venues, strategically located on opposite sides of the Island, became the goto performance spaces for local and touring musical acts.
