A Newfoundland rock music legend passed away a few weeks ago.

Bryan Hennessey's career as an actor and musician spanned some 55 years. As a musician, he was well known as a bass player, but also played keyboards, harmonica, and guitar. And he dabbled in singing and song writing. In his later decades, he devoted most of his energies to acting, writing, and directing for the theatre.
